The balance from June 1, had been \$332.32; expenses of \$56.02, and membership dues of \$20, thus the present financial condition of the organization. A special committee was established in order to find additional Federation officers. It looks like we will be able to report next time that our composition of officers will be complete.

In a response to a request at the last Federation meeting, I sent a letter to Winand Hess, a former Historian of our organization, to return archival material so an exhibit can be mounted for SESCAL'S 60th

Anniversary next year. Unfortunately, no response has been forthcoming. If any member has material going back these past 60 years, please give them to your representative to have at our next meeting. I will gladly accept any material, donated or loaned, for this special anniversary. We are hoping to have some special events, cake and libations etc., in order to celebrate this milestone in our organization's history. ### Bit of Federation history found at SESCAL '03

A piece of Federation history was found in a SESCAL 2003 dealer's cover box, showing only a boxed Oxnard, Calif., cancel and an address. The dealer mentioned it was a stamp club newsletter, and it turned out to be Vol. 2, No. 4, of the Federated Philatelic Clubs of Southern California Bulletin, dated Jan. 15, 1948.

The typeset bulletin is eight pages, which measure 5½ by 6 inches, and was published every month by Landon C. Wait of Oxnard, the Federation secretary and apparently a dealer.

It reports news from 33 member clubs, including the Womans Philatelic Society, based in Los Angeles, and the Stamp Dealers Association of

So. Calif. Inc.; contains a few advertisements; reports on a coming stamp show sponsored by the Oneonto Stamp Club, which expected 100 frames of exhibits; and notes that the Federation's regular monthly meeting would be held Friday, Feb. 13, at the Pasadena Athletic Club. The San Gabriel Valley Philatelic Society was the host.

Editor's corner**Among our top stories: Federation Philatelist of Year**

As this is written, I have just received my Linn's Stamp News that wraps up the big news of 2003.

I'm tempted to do my own top 10 list of stories involving Southern California philately, but, because my work schedule doesn't let me attend most Federation meetings, I probably don't know most of them — and some of the ones I do know I'd rather not put in print at the moment.

But it seems to me that topical collectors must have had a good year, with the issuing of "Lord of the Rings" stamps by New Zealand possibly starting a new col-

lecting topic — or at least expanding on the movies on stamps topic.

The Federation, of course, had its annual big story, the naming of a Philatelist of the Year, chosen by last year's winner, Dr. Larry Parks.

Here is what he said about his choice, Dr. Jerome V. V. Kasper:

Physical chemist with BS from Cal Tech and PhD from UC Berkeley; Associate Professor of Physical Chemistry at UCLA 1966-82.

Now a senior scientist at Aerospace Corp.

Lifelong philatelist specializ-

ing for the past 30 years in aerogrammes of the world, exhibiting and winning many awards, both in the United States and abroad, including the single frame Champion of Champions at the 2001 APS show in Riverside, Calif., for his New Zealand Prisoner of War aerogrammes. Incidentally, he received the VENPEX 2003 Grand Award for his Aerogramme Errors, Freaks and Oddities.

I hope all your stamp collecting dreams came true at Christmas and that 2004 will be good to all of you.
