### FEDERATION AWARDS:

In addition to the exhibitors' awards listed on page 3, two other awards presented at the SESCAL banquet deserve mention (these were the two items I especially wanted more information on):

The Distinguished Service Award went to Gennaro A. Santangelo and was presented by Larry Sherman, the 2006 recipient

A special award, the Exemplary Service Award, was given to Wallace Craig, longtime chairman of SESCAL. This was the first time since 1993 that the award was given.
